 - Stigma around getting Herpes
 - Standardized material to give to students?

- What are people doing for programming for students who are not engaging in sex?
 - Sex alternative kits at sex education events that include ways to love someone without having sex, love language quiz, love notes (post-it notes), pens, cards, gum, Hershey kisses. Love language quiz and activity at “Late Nite” (campus alcohol alternative programming) on February 12th
 - programming on communication in relationships
 - “We’ve done a workshop called "Rolling with Rejection" that's focused on GBV prevention--how to handle and roll with it if someone says no to sexual activity. I like helping students learn how to cope with relationships that end”
